Infection preventionists (IP) requirement also remains and at least on a part-time basis for nursing facilities. Deadline to hire IP extended to February 1, 2022. Waiver added for good faith effort but failure to find IP.

Comprehensive personal care homes, residential health care facilities and dementia care homes moved from nursing facility requirements to separate assisted living provisions section. Requirement for these facilities to hire at least pert time for individual facilities and full-time for up to five co-owned facilities. **Deadline to hire IP extended to February 1, 2022. Waiver added for good faith effort but failure to find IP.**
