### **Governor's CV Concerns:**

- 1) Governor's CV conveyed concern that this bill is, in many ways, redundant of the requirements found in the Uniform Fire Code ("UFC") — which has been adopted and is enforced by the Division of Fire Safety ("DFS") in the Department of Community Affairs ("DCA") — and bypasses the standard process by which DFS updates the UFC.
- 2) The CV also noted that the UFC also already imposes larger penalties for noncompliance than those that would be imposed under the bill.
- 3) Finally, he expressed concern about requiring all building owners to submit compliance certificates with DCA, and subsequently requiring DCA to initiate enforcement actions for noncompliance. The CV noted that is out of step with the State's current fire protection regime, wherein local enforcing agencies are primarily responsible for inspections and enforcement, with the exception of certain jurisdictions where DFS has assumed the local agency's responsibilities.
